

Congratulations to all the Branch Awards of Excellence nominees and winners and also to all of our Club Perpetual Award winners, both Senior and Junior. These nominees and winners, are all very well deserved and demonstrate the strength we have as a club across all the disciplines in Surf Lifesaving.

A Surf Club just doesn't work without an awesome person who takes on the role of Club Secretary, therefore a massive thank you goes to Kristal Lockwood who's stepping down from that challenging role. With my time as President ending, I reflect upon my time in the challenging role. I sincerely wish the incoming Executive Committee all the best going into the future building on the solid foundation we see the Club in today from a financial, lifesaving and competitive perspective.

We had another season of zero coastal drownings at our beach during the 23 – 24 season, this is a real credit to our members who patrol our beach every weekend and public holidays from September to April each year.

Our educators, led by Craig Le Brocq, have shown again this past season what collaborative teamwork can achieve; not only at our club delivering over 600 individual re-qualifications, but assisting across the whole Central Coast Branch helping our fellow clubs delivering training and assessing courses. This is a real credit to the team who constantly promote Shelly Beach Surf Club and has earnt a reputation as a "can do" team throughout the Branch.

Our competitive teams across the club from Nippers to Masters continued to excel this competition season. The highlight for me was our Masters team, who at State finished 4th overall. The Masters team also placed 9th overall at Aussies held on the Gold Coast and I look forward to seeing the upcoming successes at the Worlds event.

The Nipper Program has been engaging and fun for all the children who either started or continued their journey through the ranks of lifesaving to become qualified lifesavers. Roughly 200 children spread across the 9 age groups were supported by Craig and his team who educated, trained and engaged those nippers developing their water and sand skills. The JAC team attended every weekend to set up for Nippers regardless of weather conditions. Most importantly those nippers have gained the confidence so that they can self-rescue and enjoy the beach safely.

The finance and sponsorship teams have ensured we are in a good financial position going forward with strong sponsorship and fundraising contributions. We have received record levels of fundraising and records levels of sponsorship this last season, and we thank everyone involved in this great result.

As our building continues to age additional funds will be required to keep up with the ongoing maintenance costs, so we cannot be complacent with expenditure, we must remain diligent in this area.

We have welcomed the new owners to Muncha's Café and are excited to continue the relationship between the Club and the new Muncha's team.

Club Captain's Report

Introduction

As this is my first year as Club Captain, I want to extend my deepest gratitude to my predecessor, Steven Lee, for teaching me the ropes of this vital role. His guidance has been invaluable.

Lifesaving Activities

Lifesaving remains the core focus of our club. Here are some key statistics from this season:

- Beach Attendance: Over 70,000 visitors
- Preventative Actions: More than 7,000 interventions to prevent serious incidents
- Rescues: Conducted over 50 rescues, with no casualties reported
- First Aid: Administered First Aid around 60 times
- Surveillance Hours: Provided approximately 8,000 hours of beach surveillance

New Implementations

This season saw the introduction of dedicated parking for patrolling members during busy periods. Although challenging to implement, this initiative is a step in the right direction to support our members.

Regular Maintenance and Events

Regular working parties ensured the club and rescue gear remained in excellent condition. We also introduced new events:

- BBQ Gatherings: Held at the beginning and end of the season, fostering camaraderie and celebrating our efforts.
- Patrol Captains' Meeting: A new tradition where all Patrol Captains gather on the last patrol day to discuss upcoming challenges while ensuring beach safety.

Challenges and Concerns

Despite our successes, we face a few challenges:

- 1. Patrolling Member Commitment: A noticeable number of patrolling members are either leaving or unable to commit to their allocated hours. This will be a significant focus for next season, as we aim to maintain our nine patrols. We may need to introduce a more flexible roster system to accommodate members' availability.
- 2. Disappearing Gear: There has been an issue with gear, particularly tubes and radios, going missing.

Off-Season Plans

In the off-season, we plan to:

- Work on and around the club to maximize space and improve organization.
- Encourage all members to contribute their ideas and labour to these projects.

Special Acknowledgements

Special thanks to my 2IC, Lynnette Vuradin. Her dedication and behind-the-scenes work have been a pillar of our club's success. Lynnette's initiative, "Ladies on Patrol," has been a fantastic innovation for member retention.



This year, we took a new approach to the Director of Surf Sports role by establishing a leadership team to oversee and manage the various responsibilities within DSS. This innovative structure has allowed us to distribute tasks more efficiently and ensure comprehensive oversight of all aspects of our operations.

This season, our goal was to build on the successes of previous years by providing our competitors with the support they needed to excel. This effort is evident in the outstanding results they achieved.

Results

NSW Pool Rescue Championships 2023 15 Gold, 24 Silver and 12 Bronze

5 Gold, 4 Silver, 2 Bronze and 1 Masters Australian and World Record

NSW Interbranch Championships 2023

The NSW Interbranch Championships were held at Fingal Bay this year and Shelly Beach had 5 competitors selected to represent the Central Coast - Deakin Wright (debut), Knoa Casey-Fernandez (debut), Zach Adams, Charlie McGeever and Tahlia Goy. The team also received valuable support from other members serving in coaching and management roles - Keaton Watts and David Smith (Coaches) and Dan Kingsley (Team Manager). We are proud that our competitors from Shelly Beach significantly contributed to the Central Coast securing second place, just behind Surf Life Saving Sydney.

Branch Championships 2024

The respective Branch Championships were held over multiple weekends early in the new year with the club finishing 7th in Nippers, 3rd in the U15 to Opens and 1st in Masters.

State Championships 2024

The Sydney Northern Beaches hosted the 2023-2024 State Championships at Queenscliff, Manly and Freshwater Beaches. Our Nippers and Opens teams finished outside the top 15 clubs but we still secured a small number of medals, most notably Tahlia Goy with Gold in the U15 Beach Sprint. In the Masters our strong team finished 4th overall behind the big Sydney club's of North Bondi, Bondi & Manly.

Australian Championships 2024

At the Aussie Championships Tahlia Goy became only our club's 6th ever Aussie Surf individual Gold Medallist in the U15 Beach Sprint while Riley Wait & Deakin Wright combined to secure Bronze in the U17 2 x 1km Beach Run Relay. Our Masters team again performed strongly to be the no. 1 club from the Central Coast, 4th from NSW and 9th in Australia out of 170 club's with Masters competing.

Finally I would like to thank Karen Faulkner and Daniel Kingsley for their support of the portfolio as well as Karen again for the grants secured that have supported Surf Sports and our members this season.


