# CLUB CAPTAIN REPORT

## Introduction

And another year of Lifesaving activities and keeping the public safe is coming to a close. This is the first season, SLS has implemented so called flexible hours and also have altered the Life Saving Agreement to allow for visitor behaviour and adapt the patrolling hours accordingly. That means, more visitors, longer hours, less visitors, less hours. At the discretion of the Patrol Captain and Duty Officer we are now allowed to send patrollers home, if there is less patronage or abhorrent weather. While it all requires a bit of fine tuning, we are on the right track to use volunteer hours more efficiently.

## Lifesaving Activities

Lifesaving remains the core focus of our club. Here are some key statistics from this season:

- Beach Attendance - approx. 60,000 people visited our beach
- Preventative Actions - 700, I believe these are crucial, the more preventative actions, the less rescues
- Rescues - 40 rescues recorded
- First Aid - 101 First Aid cases recorded, majority for stings
- Total Patrolling hours - 7,750

## New Implementations

Under the virtue of "Flexibility" we also introduced a flexible rostering system for this season. Feedback was mixed, the most positive is that members can basically now choose the days, when they want to do patrol. As a negative, patrols were very mixed and sometimes people didn't know, who is showing up. Unfortunately some members didn't show up, even when their name was put down on the roster. Also organizing subs needs some improvement.

## Regular Maintenance and Events

Regular working parties ensured the club and rescue gear remained in excellent condition.

- BBQ Gatherings: We still had our events for the beginning and the end of the season to celebrate our great comrades
- Patrol Captains' Meeting: Those are very important to exchange ideas about patrolling, this is usually happening twice a season physically and remotely during the season.

## Challenges and Concerns

Despite our successes, we face a few challenges:

- Patrolling Member Decline: Even now the overall numbers in the club are up, the number of committed patrolling members is going down. Especially getting more specific qualifications like IRB Driver or Crew. These are crucial positions and without these people we cannot open the beach
- Disappearing Gear: Again as in previous seasons, gear is missing in action or doesn't get put back where it belongs. In general, the treatment of the club and all its assets needs improving.

## Off-Season Plans

As per usual, there will be some working bees to clean the club, all the gear and put it back in order. On top of that, a stock take will occur to see what we've got and what we need to order.

Work has already commenced on the new roster for the upcoming season 2025-2026. Working close together will all the Patrol Captains, we will have dedicated Teams, but the Members will still have the option to choose their dates (if the ones chosen for them doesn't suit). We will also try to introduce a Buddy system to make it easier for subs and that everyone has a mentor.

This season, we introduced a modular training approach, allowing multiple trainers to deliver different components of each course. This gave participants access to a broader range of teaching styles and experiences, making sessions more engaging, interactive, and effective. Feedback from members has been overwhelmingly positive, and we're excited to continue refining this model.

We also deepened our collaboration with Trainers, Assessment, and Facilitators across the branch. Skills Maintenance is a critical component of our training program, ensuring that members retain and refresh their lifesaving skills annually. This season, we completed a total of 241 Skills Maintenance awards across various categories.

This season, our members earned 57 lifesaving awards, recognising their commitment to developing their skills and serving the community. These awards include Radio Operator Certificate, First Aid, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques, Surf Rescue Certificate, Bronze Medallion, Gold Medallion, IRB Crew Certificate, Silver Medallion IRB Driver, and Rescue Water Craft Operator Certificate.

We also celebrated the long-term dedication of our members through the National Patrol Service Awards. These milestones reflect the incredible commitment of our members to keeping our beaches safe year after year.

As we look to the 2025–2026 season, we're excited to build on this momentum. Our goals include:

- Expanding our Holidaymakers Beach Safety Talks to reach more visitors and promote proactive beach safety education
- Enhancing our modular training model with more scenario-based learning and real-time feedback

## Season Highlights

Firstly many thanks to all those who enabled our members to compete - coaches, officials, IRB drivers and crew, water safety and team managers.

This season saw competitors in the full range of competitions commencing with the pool rescue season, the Lifesaving World Championships into the Forster Weekend of Surf, Coolangatta Gold and finishing with Aussies on the Gold Coast. Key results for the club were:

- Branch Pool Rescue - Champions
- Branch Masters - Champions
- Branch Opens - 4th
- Branch Age Champs - 4<sup>th</sup> on the sand and 6<sup>th</sup> in the water
- NSW Masters - 4th

Individually we saw some key achievements including:

- NSW State Pool Rescue Team - Riley Wait & Dan Kingsley
- Lifesaving World Championships - Our largest ever team to contest such a championship and amongst a haul of medals our first females to win Gold at this event with Carlee McKay, Sarah Willis, Steph Carey, Amy Wigham, Jacqui Eaton & Jasmine Lamont all collecting Masters Gold
- NSW Interbranch Championships at Cape Hawke - Tahlia Goy leading the Shelly Beach contingent returning to the team for the 3<sup>rd</sup> time to be joined by Zach Adams, Knoa Casey-Fernandez, Imogen Hyslop (debut) and Arielle Richold (debut) where the team finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the State
- Tahlia Goy then went on to be selected in the Hunter Central Coast Orcas as well as the Central Coast Trans Tasman team which travelled to New Zealand in January. Tahlia also was the club's Overall Competitor of the Year for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row
- In the Pool Rescue season Tom Simpson and Dan Kingsley both set records - Tom an Australian Record and Dan 4 Australian Records and 2 World Records
- Aussies - A strong Masters team contested this event with Amy Wigham & Jacqui Eaton becoming the club's 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> earners of Aussie Gold
